Sport Management (SPORT D424)

Associate in Applied Science Degree and Certificates

The Sport Management degree will provide entry-level employment training for individuals interested in careers in the rapidly growing sport and recreation industry. Employment settings include sports and fitness marketing and sales, sport retail management, recreation program planning, facilities director, and athletic coaching positions. The AAS degree includes a significant portion of general education courses to facilitate transfer to a four-year university. The Sport Management program is currently articulated with the University of Southern Indiana for students to transfer into one of their four Sport Management tracks: Intercollegiate Athletics, Recreational Sports, Sport Communication, or Sport Business Studies.
