WHAT WE DO

Olney Central College's Administration of Justice program offers students a chance to learn what it is really like in the world of law and order. Courses are taught by individuals who are active in the criminal justice system and have considerable experience in the law enforcement field. They bring practical knowledge to the classroom — a great asset in training students in law enforcement.

The program is designed for individuals wishing to enter law enforcement or those already in the field who desire a degree.



REQUIREMENTS

While enrolled in the program, students gain the skills needed to work and advance in the field. Courses include Criminal Law, Criminal Investigations, and Police Organization and Operations.

Students preferring two years of college will follow the curriculum for the Associate in Applied Science Degree and can pursue a law enforcement career immediately upon successful completion. Those planning to transfer beyond OCC to a four-year institution in order to complete the Administration of Justice baccalaureate degree will typically complete an Associate in Science and Arts Degree. These students will take general education courses coupled with Administration of Justice courses and work closely with advisors to ensure proper electives are selected.



CAREERS

The Administration of Justice Degree can lead to positions in police departments, correctional facilities, the courts, probation and parole offices, working with juveniles, and even private enforcement agencies that often specialize in security or investigation. There are also jobs in almost all federal agencies, as these offices have enforcement branches vital to everyday functions.

Opportunities are dependent, of course, upon recruiting standards of each particular agency. Students should see an advisor for this program.
