LTC HONORS STUDENTS

Numerous Lincoln Trail College students were honored during the 23rd Annual Honors Night. The annual event recognizes students for their achievements in the classroom.

LTC REMEMBERS KEN STRIEBY



Lincoln Trail College is mourning the loss of Ken Strieby, who died unexpectedly May 6.

Strieby served as the director of LTC's Concert, Jazz, and Pep bands. He also spent decades performing with LTC's ensembles and acted in numerous plays and musicals at LTC.

"Ken Strieby touched so many lives. His talent was amazing and so versatile. He could just make a face and steal the show. But he was so much more than an accomplished actor, musician, and performer. He was an educator. A collaborator. A storyteller. A friend and supporter who made everyone feel valuable and appreciated. Ken was kind, caring, passionate about his art and so positive. He was generous onstage and off," said LTC Theater Director Barbara Shimer, who was also a longtime friend of Strieby.

Shimer remembers Strieby as kind and generous and saw how much he encouraged those around him. She also remembers how much of a family man Strieby was.

LTC Director of Music Rebecca Carmack says she learned a lot in the short time she knew Strieby. "Ken was a creative genius whether he was acting, singing, playing the saxophone, or conducting. His passion for the arts was contagious to everyone around him. It is safe to say that Ken inspired numerous members of the community with his love for the arts. Ken was also a brilliant educator. He knew this community well and he knew what worked in the classroom. I learned a great deal from him in the short time we knew each other."

Shimer set up an account on GoFundMe to help the Strieby family with their final expenses.

SUMMER GED CLASSES BEGIN JUNE 12



Lincoln Trail College will work to help more students earn their high school equivalence beginning June 12.

Since July 1, 2016, 30 students have earned a GED through Lincoln Trail College. Rena Gower, who runs LTC's GED program, says that's the highest success rate she's seen in her seven years at the college.

"I am so proud of the hard work and determination those in our program and the teachers that work with them have," said Gower.

The GED classes at Lincoln Trail College are offered for free and there's no charge for the textbooks. Gower says the Improving Lives Scholarship can help people in the program with other expenses they might have.

The GED classes are available to students 16-years-old and older, but students 16- and 17-years-old do need to have separation papers from their high school. The classes meet two evenings per week from 5-9 p.m.

Orientation and registration for the summer GED classes takes play June 5 at 5 p.m. Gower says people wanting to sign-up for the class should call her at 618-544-5486 to get on the list.

The Lincoln Trail College Statesmen will offer a pair of camps in early June.

The 2017 Summer Kids Basketball Camp runs June 5-7 from noon to 3 p.m. each day. The camp is open to boys and girls from 7-16-years-old.

Lincoln Trail College coaches and players will work with the kids on basketball fundamentals like dribbling, shooting, passing, rebounding, and defense. The kids will also get a chance to play different games during the camp and they can win prizes. Each camper gets a T-shirt.

The cost of the camp is \$75 and families entering more than one child will pay \$50 for each additional sibling.

The Statesmen will offer a team camp June 9-11.

The cost of the Statesmen Team Camp is \$400 per team, but teams entering two teams can pay \$750.





Former Lincoln Trail College pitcher Justin Hancock ('11) is headed to the Chicago Cubs' organization.

The Cubs traded utility player Matt Szczur to the Padres in exchange for Hancock.

Hancock had been with the Padres' organization since they selected him in the 9th round of the 2011 draft.

Hancock has played for six teams in the Minor League, including stints with the Padres' AAA affiliate in El Paso in 2015 and 2016.

In his career, Hancock has a 24-29 record with a 3.91 ERA. He's pitched 481.2 innings and has struck out 356 batters.

In two seasons with the Statesmen, Hancock compiled a 9-8 record with one save. He had a 4.58 ERA while striking out 98 batters.
