

CPR Health Care Provider Classes

Frontier Community College will conduct American Heart Association CPR Health Care Provider classes at the IECC West Richland Center (the former West Richland High School) in Noble. Dates available are October 8, November 17, or December 1. These dates are for individuals currently working in the health care systems. A healthcare provider can be an EMT, a medic, doctor, nurse, dentist, CNA – anyone working in healthcare. The American Heart certification is good for two years, but most healthcare agencies require their employees update each year. A CPR and First Aid class for the public is scheduled for November 19 at the IECC West Richland Center.

Adjunct Instructor Gene Kollak is teaching two courses this fall: Construction Fundamentals and Framing/Finishing Fundamentals.

Their next project will take place at Wayne County Well Survey just down the street from FCC's campus. Under Kollak's instruction, students will build an office, kitchen, restroom, and a storage area in the newly constructed building. "This project is perfect timing for our class" stated Kollak. "It goes right along with our textbooks perfectly."
