Candidate Forum Draws Visitors Throughout IECC District

A crowd of over 75 were in attendance for the District 109 Candidate Forum, which was held on Frontier Community College's campus Monday, September 24. The event was co-sponsored by FCC, the Wayne County Farm Bureau, and the Student Senate club.

After a welcome by President Dr. Jay Edgren, the hour-long forum included a dozen questions that were submitted by District 109 citizens prior to the event. Republican candidate Darren Bailey and Democrat candidate Cynthia Given received the questions approximately ten minutes before the forum began, and each candidate was allowed three minutes to respond to each question. Topics discussed included fiscal and social policies affecting the State of Illinois, such as taxes, agricultural legislation, public education, labor unions, and more.

The State House District 109 covers all of Clay, Edwards, Jasper, Richland, Wabash, Wayne, and White counties. It also covers portions of Lawrence and Effingham counties. Election Day is Tuesday, November 6.

FCC Reports Strong School Loan Repayment Data

Utilizing data from the U.S. Department of Education, an SE Illinois News article recently published a list of twoyear Illinois colleges reporting on the number of borrowers in default. Fifty-six colleges were named to the list, and Frontier Community College ranked 4th with a total number of eight borrowers.

The data examines borrowers who began repaying school loans in 2014 and includes only those who earned an associate's degree from a two-year college. The 2014 cohort accounts for borrowers who entered repayment on selected federal loans in the given fiscal year and defaulted before the end of the second fiscal year.

SE Illinois News reported the data in terms of number of borrowers rather than an overall percentage. Data from Illinois Eastern Community Colleges reports that the 2014 cohort for FCC was approximately 14 percent, or eight borrowers. For fiscal year 2015, FCC's default rate was only nine percent, or three borrowers.

IECC was well represented in the report, as all four colleges ranked within the top ten for lowest number of borrowers in default. OCC ranked 5th (10 borrowers), WVC ranked 8th (12 borrowers), and LTC ranked 9th (13 borrowers).

Reporting the highest number of borrowers in default was the College of DuPage, located in Glen Ellyn, Illinois. The college has an enrollment of approxiately 26,000 students, and 540 borrowers defaulted on school loans they began repaying in 2014.

City of Fairfield Assists EDS Program with New Utility Pole Installation





On October 4, the City of Fairfield's Electrical Department visited the campus of FCC to assist in replacing nine utility poles for the Electrical Distribution Systems Program. The utility poles, which are located behind Workforce Development Center, had become heavily worn over the years, as students spend many hours training in the areas of pole climbing and cross arm construction.

EDS students climbed up the poles to remove all cross arms. The City's linemen then used their equipment to remove the poles, dig holes, and install the new utility poles. The day-long project was overseen by City of Fairfield lineman Tyler Lashbrook, who graduated from Frontier's EDS Program in 2011.

The City of Fairfield's Electrical Department has visited FCC's campus on previous occasions to provide unique learning experiences for EDS students. Last spring, Lashbrook brought a bucket truck with a 100-foot working height, and students were able to ascend to the top for an aerial view of Fairfield. Students in the program use a bucket truck with a 50-foot working height, which is the same height as the tallest utility pole on campus.

Athletics Plans 2nd Annual Monster Mash



Frontier Bobcats Athletics has scheduled the 2nd-annual Monster Mash Charity Game for Monday,

October 29. The game will begin at 5PM on FNB Field, and the public is invited to attend this spooky showdown. A trunk-or-treat, sponsored by FCC student clubs, will be held directly before the game on the Bobcat Den parking lot.

All proceeds from the night will be donated to the Dr. Scranton Cancer Memorial Fund, which supports local cancer victims.


