The GED Test

GED Tests must be given at a Pearson Vue Testing Center. All Four IECC Colleges (Fronter Community College, Wabash Valley College, Olney Central, and Lincoln Trail College) are licensed centers and administrators for the GED test.

There are four parts to the GED test:

- Reasoning through Language Arts
- Mathematical Reasoning
- Science
- · Social Studies

Each test costs \$30. FCC can waive test fees for two GED tests for qualified students.

Students must sign up and pay for a GED testing appointment 24 hours in advance at the GED testing website: www.myged.com

Eligible Frontier Community College GED students will be offered free practice test vouchers to determine test readiness.

Adult Education Classes

GED Test Preparation is designed to prepare students for the New GED Computer Based test

i-Pathways classes are online GED classes for students who have a 9th grade reading level or above, are self-starters, have computer access, and internet access.

Career Bridge courses are classes designed to help students develop the necessary skills to understand and apply academic knowledge to the career industry chosen and/or additional post-secondary education.

Transition Skills Classes are designed to prepare adults who plan to enter college and/or need to build employment skills. These classes are also available online.

To Register for Classes:

The Adult Education classes require an intake Assessment during registration. This initial assessment will include students completing a reading assessment during the registration and orientation process. This assessment will determine class placement.
