OCC Theatre completes first phase of updates

The first phase of the Olney Central College Theatre's three-year, \$50,000 fund-raising campaign is now complete with the addition of a new dual projection system in the Dr. John D. Stull Performing Arts Center.

"The new equipment was installed just prior to our *Frozen* Sing-Along Movie Night, which was extremely successful," said OCC Theatre Director Jon Wright. "The kids had a lot of fun and we are looking forward to presenting more events like this in the future."

The new equipment was purchased with donations and grants including \$5,000 from both the Olney Arts Council and the Carrie Winter Charitable Trust. Contributions from OCC Theatre alumni alone have totaled more than \$6,500 since the

Conference brings nationally-known experts on Kennedy, King assassinations to OCC

The nation's foremost experts on the assassinations of John F. Kennedy, Robert F. Kennedy and Martin Luther King Jr. will gather April 4-8 for a conference at Olney Central College.

Sponsored by the JFK Historical Group, Political Assassinations of the 1960s will explore, in an academic setting, the deaths of these three iconic leaders focusing on new details, which have emerged more than a half-century later. The conference will feature an outstanding array of authors, researchers, historians, educators and college professors, who possess extensive knowledge on the subjects.

"We are excited to bring together a diverse panel of speakers who will shed light on these events," said conference organizer and longtime JFK researcher Professor David Denton. "Enough important events are occurring in these cases which merit closer scrutiny."

A highlight of the event will be Saturday evening's banquet featuring keynote speakers Lisa Pease, who spent 25 years researching her book, *A Lie Too Big to Fail: The Real History of the Assassination of Robert F. Kennedy*, and Ed Tatro, one of the nation's preeminent JFK assassination researchers. Both will give other presentations throughout the conference.

Pease's book was featured prominently in a recent *Washington Post* article exploring a CIA connection to the assassination of former Attorney General Robert Kennedy during his 1968 presidential primary campaign. The story quotes Robert Kennedy Jr., who believes the intelligence


Tickets on sale for OCC Theatre's 'The Wizard of Oz'

IST Program Information Night April 2

Individuals interested in learning more about OCC's Information Systems Technology Program are invited to attend a free Information Night at 6 p.m. on Tuesday, April 2 in Wattleworth Hall, Room 107.

"We want people to come out and have an opportunity to learn more about the program and what it offers," said IST Specialist PJ Zeilstra. "It would be especially helpful for high school students, who are interested in IT or computer science careers, and their parents."

The IST Program, which begins in August, provides students access to a state-of-the-art lab while preparing them for jobs in areas such as Network Technician, Help Desk Support Technician, Network Administrator, Cybersecurity Analyst, Internet of Things Technician and Data Analyst.

Students can earn a two-year transfer degree, which offers electives and gives students the basics of IST; a two-year degree that incorporates more technology and enables students to enter the workforce right away; and a one-year certificate, which prepares students for entry-level positions in the field. Graduates also will be prepared to take multiple industry certifications through the Cisco Networking Academy.

Jodi Schneider has joined Olney Central College serving in the newly created advisor/recruiter position.



organization played a role in his father's death. Kennedy recently appeared on *The Alec Baldwin Show* calling for a new investigation into his father's death and requesting a new trial for convicted assassin Sirhan Sirhan.

Tatro, a dynamic and engaging speaker, was a key contributor to the popular *The Men Who Killed Kennedy* series featured on the History Channel. He will present new and compelling information and evidence regarding the JFK assassination.

The banquet will begin at 6:15 p.m. at The Holiday in Olney with presentations by Pease and Tatro to follow at 7 and 8 p.m., respectively. The cost for the banquet is \$40.

Denton said the National Archives' release in 2017 and 2018 of previously classified documents related to the JFK assassination have resulted in new revelations making the conference a timely event.

"These recently declassified documents open new avenues into investigations. Although some documents remain classified, because of the recent release more information has come to light that paints a clearer picture of conspiracy in Dallas," said Denton, who has taught the course, "Political Assassinations of the 1960s," for 17 years at Olney Central College. "The fact that Robert Kennedy Jr. has gone on the record questioning the official stories of both his father's and uncle's deaths brings renewed significance to these cases. Having this conference in an academic setting, I honestly

believe it will bring forth significant information the public has not been aware of up to this point. In particular, I feel we have one of the best lineups of any conference yet associated with the assassination of RFK."

Calls are also coming for a new investigation into King's death on the balcony of Memphis' Lorraine Motel on April 4, 1968. On the recent King Holiday, a national petition was circulated requesting the government reopen the case. King's family has been asking since the 1990s that the circumstances surrounding the civil rights leader's slaying be reexamined.

"We believe the timing of this conference couldn't be any better," Denton added. "The conference activities start on the 51st anniversary of the assassination of Martin Luther King Jr."

Conference events begin at 7:30 p.m. on Thursday, April 4 with a showing of Randolph Benson's film *The Searchers*, winner of the 2017 Tiburon International Film Festival's Orson Welles Award. A question and answer session with Benson, an instructor of film and video at Duke University, will follow. A meet and greet with the speakers will run from 9 to 10 p.m.

The first full day of activities will begin at 9 a.m. on Friday, April 5 with presentations continuing throughout the evening. Speakers will include Casey Quinlan, Brian Edwards, David Knight, Ed Tatro, Mal Hyman, Judyth Baker, Chris Fulton, Damon Ise, Lisa Pease and John Barbour.

The conference will resume at 8:15 a.m. on Saturday, April 6 with featured

speakers Jeff Worcester, Richard Bartholomew, Larry Rivera, Ed Tatro, Kris Millegan, David Denton, Victoria Hawes-Sulzer, Phil Nelson, William Law and Stan Weeber.

On Sunday, April 7, sessions will start at 9 a.m. Speakers include Shane O'Sullivan, Lisa Pease and Ed Tatro. A luncheon and meet and greet with the speakers will begin at 12:30 p.m. at the Elk's in Olney.

On Monday, April 8, John Barbour's film *The American Media and the Second Assassination of President John F. Kennedy* will be shown at 6:30 p.m. Barbour is best known as "The Godfather of Reality TV," for creating and co-hosting NBC's trend-setting No. 1 hit, *Real People*.

He was chosen by New Orleans' District Attorney Jim Garrison to be the one to tell his story. The Garrison Tapes won the San Sebastian Film Festival Award in 1992 and the sequel, The American Media and the Second Assassination of President John F. Kennedy, is regarded as the absolute definitive film on the subject. A question and answer session with Barbour will follow the showing.

The cost for residents of the Illinois Eastern Community Colleges District is \$6.50 per session, \$13.50 per day or \$40 for all conference activities, excluding the keynote banquet.

All events will be held in the Dr. John D. Stull Performing Arts Center at Olney Central College unless otherwise noted.

Phase 2 will include the installation of backstage audio and video monitors. The planned renovations will conclude the following year with the placement of a modern lighting system.

Wright said updates to OCC's 43-year-old theater ensure audiences will continue to enjoy professional productions for years to come.

The improvements also will benefit the OCC Band and Choir, Olney Arts Council activities, the Southeastern Illinois Concert Association and area dance studios, which utilize the performing arts center.

Wright is grateful for the support the project has received from the community and the college.

"Throughout all of our growth in the theater in the last few years, our administration has been excellent in supporting us," he said. "It is so nice to have an administration who supports the arts in our community."
