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'Beauty and the Beast' sets record ticket sales



Disney's "Beauty and the Beast" set a record for opening-day ticket sales for the OCC Theatre. On Feb. 28, 835 tickets were purchased. As of March 7, ticket sales totaled 1,520. OCC Theatre Director Ruth Henry is encouraging those who want to attend the upcoming performances to reserve their seats as soon as possible. The Olney Central College Theatre is reporting record ticket sales for its upcoming production of Disney's "Beauty and the Beast."

Director Ruth Henry said 835 tickets were sold on Feb. 28, the opening day of ticket sales.

"The response has been overwhelming," Henry said. "I've never seen anything like it. It's thrilling and exciting. At one point, we had 120 phone messages for tickets and a line stretching from the ticket window to the front door. Previously, the most tickets we had sold in a single day was 500 and we thought that was huge."

As of March 7, 1,520 tickets have been sold.

Lynn Gray named LSC's Tutoring Coordinator

Gray is both observing and assisting with instruction in the criminalistics course.

Gray will complete her bachelor's degree in criminology in December. She then plans to begin graduate work at ISU in the emerging field of victimology. This specialized area of criminology focuses on the relationships between victims and offenders as well as the interactions between victims and the criminal justice system.

In her new position, Gray will be coordinating student tutoring sessions for the LSC and working closely with its Director Donita Kaare.

Have your SIU-C application approved April 21

The Southern Illinois University at Carbondale Service Center at IECC is making it easy to submit your application to SIU-C. Instead of completing an application, mailing it and waiting patiently for an acceptance letter, SIU-C Transfer Coordinator Amanda Sutton will be at

OCC on April 21 to validate your acceptance on the spot. However, she will not be able to conduct on-the-spot acceptance for international or high school students.

Students will need to schedule a 15-minute appointment between 9 a.m. to noon and 1 to 3 p.m. The earlier you sign up, the more time slots you may choose from.

Students will be completing the application during the meeting and will need to have their official transcript with them. There is a \$30 application fee, which may be waived for eligible students.

The 2011-2012 FAFSAs (Free Application for Federal Student Aid) are available online at www.fafsa.ed.gov.

To ensure the maximum assistance from federal and state aid, you must apply early. Students who attend Summer 2011 must apply for both the 2010-2011 and 2011-2012 FAFSA.

Please be aware that information from your 2010 Federal 1040, 1040A, or 1040EZ, is necessary prior to com-

In 2010-2011, approximately 50 percent of students at OCC did not receive full funding of federal and state financial aid because they did not file early. Students who apply early receive the most aid, as funds are limited.

OCC has a priority deadline of April 15, 2011 for FAFSA filing.

Digital photography class starts March 15

Take your photography to the next level by enrolling in Olney Central College's digital photography course.

During the 8-week class, professional photographer Tim Dunahee will assist students in reviewing basic knowledge of their cameras' preprogrammed functions and mode settings. Students also will gain an understanding of ISO, aperture and shutter speed and how one affects the other.

"The class will have hands-on work, where

we will leave the classroom and shoot various photos learning how to adjust the cameras to various light settings, depending on what we are trying to photograph," Dunahee said.

In addition, Dunahee will address basic photo techniques and teach students how to frame photos and pose individuals and groups in photographs. Dunahee will even bring in other professional photographers to share their insights with the students.

Dunahee has been
