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ELECTRICAL DISTRIBUTION PROGRAM RECEIVES GRANT

The Frontier Community College Electrical Distribution Program was recently awarded a materials grant valued at over \$36,000 from the ISPC (Institute for Safety in Powerline Construction). Included in this grant is a set of 78 Instructional DVDs as well as 78 instructor guides. These state-of-the-art videos allow students to get an up-close look at many different aspects of being a line-person. They will also allow the program’s instructor to provide a much higher quality of instruction when classes move online after the Thanksgiving Holiday. As part of the grant, FCC has become a member of the ISPC which will give the college access to training webinars, discounts, and other content.
