NJCAA All-Academic Teams

The National Junior College Athletic Association announced its All-Academic Teams for the 2021-2022 year. Frontier had a total of 43 student-athletes who were named on one of the teams, including 18 first-team athletes with a 4.0 GPA, 17 second-team with a GPA between 3.8-3.99, and 8 thirdteam with a GPA between 3.6-3.79. Collectively, the three teams performed well academically and ranked highly. The FCC baseball team placed 8th nationally, inlcuding a tie for the top rank in the IECC and Region 24. The softball team finished 19th nationally, 1st in the IECC, and 3rd in Region 24. Finally, the volleyball team finished 4th nationally and 1st in both the IECC and in Region 24. All of the coaches and student-athletes at FCC take pride with their performance both on the field as well as in the classroom.



- FCC's Medical Laboratory Technician program welcomes Cindy Green as Adjunct Faculty for the Fall 2022 semester. Green brings over 40 years of lab experience to FCC, having worked for Carle-Richland in Olney, IL as Lead Chemistry Technologist for 27 years. She also spent time as a phlebotomist, lab assistant and MLT assistant at Carle and part-time in the lab at Wabash General Hospital in Mt. Carmel, IL. Green has received multiple degrees including one from FCC in Health Informatics. She also received an Associate of Science from Wabash Valley College and a Bachelor of Arts in General Studies from Eastern Illinois University. Green's extensive experience will be of great value to FCC's students and the Title III program is excited to add her to the team.
- On July 13, 2022, Life Science Associate Professor Nixie Hnetkovsky was awarded Master Reviewer Certification by Quality Matters (QM)- the highest level of QM training. To earn the designation, Hnetkovsky completed 4 weeklong classes in Applying the QM Rubric in addition to a Peer Reviewer class. At the conclusion of the classes, she was required to participate as a team member of QM peer reviews for outside insitutions. Each peer review was appoximately 4 weeks in duration and Hnetkovsky served as a reviewer for Development Pyschology and Professional Communications. Additionally, she served as a peer review team subject matter for General Biology II. Upon completes of trainings and course reviews, Hnetkovsky enrolled in the Master Reviewer course and was admitted after passing the entry examination. Finally, the last 4 weeks were spent completing rigorous training to prepare her as the Master Reviewer/Team Leader. The FCC Title III program would like to Congraulate Nixie on this landmark achievement and is thankful for her commitment and dedication to improving online education at FCC.
- Distance Learning Specialist Debbie Bryant and Education Technology Specialist Derek Dunn have successfully updated the online New Student Orientation Plus (NSO+) for Fall 2022. As part of the update, videos were created to improve student awareness of FCC's campus and available student support including one new production starring FCC's own Bobcat.
