

- The amount of time and expertise needed in preparing classes to go online or hybrid can be intimidating for many instructors, especially adjuncts. FCC Distance Learning Specialist Debbie Bryant works one-on-one with full-time and adjunct instructors to prepare hybrid classes that are engaging, exciting, and easy for students to navigate. The final product is a high-quality educational experience for the students and a pain free transition for the instructor.
- Debbie Bryant has attained the certification as a "master reviewer" through Quality Matters, an internationally recognized program aimed at providing quality assurance for online courses across the world. Debbie collaborates with the instructor to build an online course from the ground up that is designed with student success as the primary objective. This year, the Title III team is continuing its course work to convert the Medical Laboratory Technician and Certified Medical Assistant programs to high quality hybrid formats.
- The Medical Laboratory Technician (MLT) program at Frontier Community College has been recommended for accreditation. This is a huge accomplishment for the MLT program. "The accreditation of FCC's MLT program is the culmination of several years of hard work by a number of individuals. It is a clear indicator that we have a strong program and are committed to providing a quality education," said Title III Project Director Morris Nead. More on the accreditation will be shared in the near future.

Business & Industry Update

- Small Business Development Center (SBDC) at IECC We were informed mid-January that Illinois Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity intends to fund a center at IECC. The SBDC will maintain an office at West Richland Center (WRC) but will also have designated days to meet clients at each college.
- Adult Mental Health & First Aid is a new training offered through the Emergency Preparedness
 department. Two sessions were recently offered, both of which were well attended and received very
 positive feedback.
- Business & Industry (B&I) will be starting a leadership class at Champion Labs, hosting a drone class for first responders as well as an excel class for MotoRad.
- B&I will also be hosting a district-wide Economic Development workshop in March for chambers of commerce, city governments, economic development agencies, etc. This will be hosted at WRC.
- B&I is working on various trainings such as Leadership training with Hella, Electrical Training and Safety
 Training with Victor Dana Corp, and AMH&FA Training with Fairfield Memorial Hospital.
