SCHOLARSHIPS DESCRIPTIONS and GUIDELINES

- EDWARD and ELMA COLE SCHOLARSHIP
In district tuition for a maximum of 16 credit hours per semester. Can be applied to Frontier Community College courses only. Award does not include fees, out of district, or out of state tuition. Student must be enrolled in a minimum of 12 credit hours per semester and maintain 3.0 GPA. Award is for 4 semesters or upon completion of an Associate degree.

 - DR. NORMAN VINCENT PEALE SCHOLARSHIP
In district tuition for a maximum of 16 credit hours per semester. Can be applied to Frontier Community College courses only. Award does not include fees, out of district, or out of state tuition. Student must be enrolled in a minimum of 12 credit hours per semester and maintain 3.0 GPA. Award is for 4 semesters or upon completion of an Associate degree. *Applicant must submit an essay of 500 words or less on the subject "The Power of Positive Thinking", the book by Dr. Peale.

 - FOUNDER'S SCHOLARSHIP
One scholarship, up to \$3000, to be awarded to a graduate of Fairfield Community High School with a minimum GPA of 3.0. Applicant must enroll full time at Frontier Community College.

 - PRESIDENT'S SCHOLARSHIP
Two scholarships, up to \$1500, to be awarded to a full time Frontier Community College student with a minimum GPA of 3.0. *Applicant must submit an essay discussing the importance of community service. Essay must be one page (minimum) in length.
- WABASH VALLEY ASSOCIATION SCHOLARSHIP
- Cash scholarship of \$1000 for one year. Applicant must enroll in a degree seeking program at Frontier Community College and maintain a 3.0 GPA. *Applicant must submit an essay regarding their thoughts and concerns for conservation in the Wabash Valley area. Essay must be one page in length.
- PUCKETT CENTENNIAL SERVICE SCHOLARSHIP
- Cash scholarship of \$500 for one year. Applicant must enroll in a degree or certificate program. Applicant must maintain a 3.0 GPA while enrolled and must be enrolled at full time status.
- FAIRFIELD COIN CLUB SCHOLARSHIP
- Cash scholarship of \$500 for one year. Applicant must plan to enroll in a degree or certificate program and maintain a 3.0 GPA. Applicant must be enrolled at full time status.
- BILL CANNON MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP
- Cash scholarship of \$500 for one year. Applicant must be a current year graduate of Fairfield Community High School who is attending Frontier Community College during the academic year following high school graduation.
- EA JOHNSON SCHOLARSHIP THROUGH CORNERSTONE COMMUNITY CHURCH
- Three scholarships, up to \$3500, to be awarded to a full time Frontier Community College student. No monetary award directly to the student is made.
