
Broadway's Original Tarzan To Direct OCC Theater Production

In a full-circle moment, Josh Strickland, the original Tarzan of Disney's Tarzan on Broadway, is making his directorial debut with Olney Central College Theater's production of Disney's Tarzan for its 50th-anniversary season.

For Strickland, this return to the beloved production is more than just a new role — it's a homecoming.

A native of Charleston, South Carolina, Strickland took Broadway by storm in 2006 when he originated the title role in Disney's Tarzan, bringing the iconic character to life with soaring vocals. His career has since spanned from the Las Vegas Strip — where he starred in Peepshow at Planet Hollywood and Vegas! The Show — to international stages, including reprising his role as Tarzan in Oberhausen, Germany.

His performances with Disney's Broadway Hits, including the Emmy-winning concert at Royal Albert Hall (streaming on

Disney+), solidified his place as a celebrated Disney theatrical performer. He recently returned from performing in Disney World at Epcot's Festival of the Arts, celebrating 30 years of Disney on Broadway.

Now, Strickland steps into the director's chair for the first time, leading OCC Theater's production of Tarzan in celebration of its milestone 50th season. For Strickland, this opportunity is not just about directing — it's about returning to the world that held a defining chapter of his career.

"I am so excited to be making my directorial debut, especially with this production of Tarzan here in Olney as they celebrate their 50th anniversary," says Strickland. "This story and this character have shaped my career in ways I could only have dreamed of, and to be able to use 20 years of experience in the business to now look at this story from a director's point of view is something I am very excited about."

Strickland's deep connection to the material, combined with his firsthand knowledge of


the role, will bring a unique perspective to this production, ensuring an unforgettable experience for Olney and the surrounding communities.

Benson has also played roles at a variety of regional theaters including Goodspeed Opera House, The Rev, Skylight Music Theatre, and Red Mountain Theatre.

OCC Phi Theta Kappa Hosts Bluey Screening as Part of Honors in Action Project

Olney Central College's Phi Theta Kappa chapter hosted a special screening of the popular television show *Bluey* on February 26 as part of its PTK Honors in Action Project.

Last fall OCC's Alpha Theta Eta Chapter received a \$1,000 grant from the national PTK organization to assist with research and planning for the project, which explores how storytelling in movies and television shows, like *Bluey*, portray real-life situations.

The Honors in Action Project promotes undergraduate academic research and engages students in an informed, intentional action meant to foster student success and fulfill PTK's mission of providing college students opportunities to grow as scholars and leaders.

"HIA combines Honors Study Topic exploration, problem-solving, and action-oriented service to address real-world challenges in our communities," said PTK Advisor Dr. Sarah Bergbower. "Students gain job-related experience while creating lasting impacts in their communities as they engage in HIA."

The chapter's involvement in HIA is also part of a broader goal to achieve recognition as a Five Star Chapter. This initiative outlines 10 essentials to creating an engaged chapter and organizes them into themed categories or stars.

"Discover is just one of the five areas of involvement under the Five Star Status plan that our chapter is working toward. Last year, we achieved a 4-star status level," Bergbower added.

The *Bluey* Preview Event brought together college and high school students, staff and children from the Buckeroo Early Education Center at OCC. After viewing three episodes of the animated series, the children answered questions about the show while older students and staff completed surveys.

PTK will use the feedback collected to complete the required research paper, which is due in May. Submissions will then be judged and winners announced in the fall.

"We had great support from not only faculty, staff and students at OCC, but also from the ROE and Buckeroo's daycare. This wide variety of age groups provided some phenomenal — both interesting and surprising — survey result data from the screening event that we will use to finalize our research paper."

PTK President Courtney Crawford is also pleased with the OCC community's support of the Bluey Preview Event.

"I feel it was very successful," Crawford said. "It was great seeing all the different ages coming together. We had wanted to gather research from a variety of ages and we were able to do that."

Those also assisting with the project included PTK Vice President Brandy Cochran and Advisor Shasta Bennett.
