OCC Student-Athletes Earn NJCAA Academic Honors

Olney Central College student-athletes excelled in the classroom during the 2024–2025 academic year, achieving impressive results that earned national recognition.

All four athletic programs were recognized as NJCAA Academic Teams of the Year — with each having players recognized as NJCAA Academic All-Americans.

"We had 22 individual Academic All-Americans, which is roughly 30 percent of all athletes," said OCC Athletic Director and Softball Coach Nick Short. "That is a crazy, high number."

All four teams earned GPAs above 3.0, a benchmark that Short says reflects a strong culture of academic excellence. He noted Men's Basketball posted its highest team GPA in his 19 years at OCC at 3.46, tying for sixth nationally.

The OCC Women's Softball team led the way with the college's top team GPA of 3.65, followed by Women's Basketball at 3.27 and Baseball at 3.17.

Short credits the combined effort of student-athletes, coaches and campus support staff for the department's continued success.

"Obviously, it begins with our athletes doing the work, and they did a fantastic job this past year in the classroom," he said. "We would not have success without our advisors, front office and support staff making sure students know about the resources available to them. Our coaching staff also plays a role in accountability and creating a culture where academics are prioritized. They all did a great job."

The NJCAA recognizes student-athletes with a 3.60 GPA or higher as Academic All-Americans. This honor is divided into three tiers: First Team for those with a 4.0 GPA, Second Team for those earning GPAs between 3.80 and 3.99, and Third Team for GPAs between 3.60 and 3.79.

Short said this year's accomplishments reflect the standard OCC athletics strives to uphold each season.

"We expect this level of commitment in the classroom every year," he said. "I believe we have had department GPAs over 3.0 every year I have been here, and we expect it to continue."


OCC Hosts Exhibit by Artist Rudy Kistler

Markman serves as OCC's TRIO Upward Bound Academic Counselor, where she helps students explore their potential and plan for bright futures. Her work guiding students toward meaningful academic programs and career pathways has not only impacted the local community, but also earned her a feature in EIU's alumni spotlight, celebrating her success and the lasting influence of her graduate education.

"Working with these students to match their unique backgrounds, passions and interests with meaningful academic programs and a focused career trajectory is extremely rewarding," Markman said in the EIU article. "Our success is a shared outcome that reflects positively on the students we serve, at Olney Central College and the whole Illinois Eastern Community Col-



leges system, and the communities and districts we serve — educationally and economically."

Markman earned her master's degree in EIU's online Higher Education and Community College program in May 2025. During her graduate studies, she developed two impactful initiatives for OCC.

Inspired by her Governance and Finance class at EIU, she established a food pantry on campus while serving as Student Support Services Specialist for the TRIO Student Support Services program, addressing food insecurities many students faced. Later, as part of her EIU academic capstone project, she researched, helped design, and is now implementing a STEM lab that will support high school students transitioning to college through the TRIO Upward Bound Program. OCC plans to host an official ribbon cutting for the new lab in the near future.

"EIU helped to give me a platform, and their experienced faculty helped to broaden my proficiency in the work-force," Markman said. "As a graduate of EIU, an employee of OCC, and a resident of Illinois, it is important to let people know about the work our institutions and communities do to advance the public good and to reinforce the economic resiliency of our region and state. Giving students a chance to succeed in their classrooms and communities and giving them the skills they need to be high performers with their future employers is a win for everyone."
