OCC Health Professions Center Open House and Dedication Dec. 11

Olney Central College will celebrate the completion of its Health Professions Center with an Open House and Dedication Ceremony on December 11.

The public is invited to explore the new 8,500-square-foot addition to Dr. Kent L. Wattleworth Hall from 3 to 7 p.m., with a formal dedication ceremony beginning at 4 p.m.

Funded through the Rebuild Illinois capital program, the \$3.15 million project represents a significant investment in the future of healthcare education and workforce readiness.

"The Health Professions Center will be used to help train the next generation of healthcare workers in our region," said Dr. Alani Frederick, Dean of Health Professions at Illinois Eastern Community Colleges. "This building represents the commitment from IECC to ensure a student-focused education."

An Illinois Capital Development Board project, the Health Professions Center features two nursing classrooms, a nursing skills lab, two nursing simulation labs, a radiography classroom and an energized radiography lab. Other amenities include a conference room, faculty offices and a commons area for students.

"With the new simulation center, all IECC Nursing students will have the opportunity to work through real world scenarios and practice high risk, low volume events such as a cardiac arrest and postpartum hemorrhage," Frederick emphasized. "The Nursing Skills Lab will feature flexible space which will reinforce IECC Nursing's commitment to active learning and allowing a safe and realistic learning environment. Our Radiography Program will have access to an energized lab, the first in IECC history. This space will allow students to practice projections in a

controlled environment, ensuring that they are safe clinicians and are ready to make the most of their clinical experiences."

Olney Central College President Chris Simpson said the center reflects OCC's ongoing dedication to providing students with a high-quality education while helping them reach their future goals.

"Olney Central College and the entire IECC district has student success at the forefront. However, much of the work in this area can be more behind the scenes," he said. "This new Health Professions Center is a highly visible example of our commitment to deliver exceptional education to help our students succeed. This project will play a pivotal role in helping us deliver on this mission by providing a state-of-the-art facility for our health professions students."

In addition to state funding, OCC has received more than \$400,000 in financial support from the community to complete the project. This includes the Olney Central College Foundation's pledge of more than \$150,000 over the next five years along with contributions from the Johnsie Flock Fildes Foundation, Wabash General Hospital, the Richland County Board and the City of Olney. OCC also received a generous gift given in memory of Phyllis Fehrenbacher by her family. Carle RMH is supporting the project through the donation of medical equipment for student use.

"The support of our donors was essential in getting this project completed," Simpson said. "As a result of each of their contributions, the Olney Central College Health Professions Center will provide an excellent learning and training environment for the next generation of nurses and radiographers. Their generosity will help to open doors for our students to enter a career in the health professions."

Construction on the Health Professions Center began in early 2025, following a groundbreaking ceremony on January 15. The new facility, designed by Graham & Hyde Architects, Inc., and built by Shores Builders, Inc., is set to welcome its first classes during the upcoming spring semester, enhancing student instruction.

"The Health Professions program at Olney Central College already has an outstanding reputation in the region," Simpson said. "The healthcare providers in this area know that OCC produces top-notch graduates that are career ready and this new facility will enhance that reputation. The enhancements in the teaching and learning process, as a result of this new facility, will allow the nursing and radiography faculty to take their students to even greater heights."
