SPOTLIGHT ON THE RADIO/TV PROGRAM AT WVC

The Radio/TV program is one of the many CTE options here at WVC. Now, you might be wondering—what exactly is a CTE? CTE stands for Career Technical Education, which refers to specialized high school or postsecondary programs that give students real hands-on experience. The Radio/TV program at Wabash Valley College does exactly that.

The program gives students opportunities like broadcasting local events and even running its own radio station, 89.1 The Bash. Getting to learn in a real studio environment is what makes this program so great. When students finish the program, they leave with actual experience and skills they can take straight into a job or transfer to a university—already equipped to step in and succeed.

Our instructor, Kyle Peach, does an amazing job of giving students ownership of their work. He makes sure we get the experience we need and keeps everything we do interesting and relevant. Also on staff is Eli Grimes, who is incredible. He's always there to help when something challenges us, and he explains all the equipment in a way that just makes sense. 
