	reass	I'll come in a moment. We'll wait for you. (Pause.) I'm sorry, Belle. its only long enough for BELLE to smile her urance and then goes, followed by HIS GIRL. There is between SCROOGE and BELLE. BELLE breaks it.
	SCROOGE	Ebenezer, deardon't you thinkdon't you feel thatthat That he's right? Is that what you're going to say? That Dick's right? (BELLE tries to interrupt but SCROOGE takes no notice.) If you think he's right Belle, then you must do what you think's best. I won't interfere. Only don't expect me to give up everything I've worked for just for the sake of some damn-fool skating party that you know as well as I do will be as boring as the last one, and doesn't do anything for any of us.
	BELLE	I wasn't going to say that. If that's the kind of life you want then you're
		welcome to it, only you'd better find someone else to give it to you, 'cos I wont.
	BELLE	You don't really care about us at all, do you?

Oh, don't be petty?

SCROOGE

RELLE

You don't, do you? Oh, you did once, I know. Four years ago when we became engaged, but its gradually dwindled away until now it hardly exists at all.

SCROOGE

For heavens sake Belle, don't start all that...

BELLE

The only thing you really care about now is money.

Money, money, money.

SCROOGE

Business is a man's life. There's no place for

women.

BELLE

Exactly, and there's no place for women in such a life. Very well, Ebenezer. You have your world of business and I hope you enjoy it. And I hope your money will bring you all the comfort you need right through your old age.

SCROOGE

Can't you begin to understand that...

BELLE

Yes, I understand completely. I understand that I'm in your way and that the only thing that will ever matter to you is making money. Well, there - take it. I'll never stand in the way of your ambition.

Stop

And she throws her ring - the engagement ring he gave her - on the ground and leaves him. He looks at it. Turns it over with his foot, then moves angrily away from it.

SCROOGE

Humbug. Parties and Christmas and the whole wretched lot of it. Nothing but humbug.

And as the MOUNG SCROOGE goes on muttering humbug, light fades from the scene and back to the SPIRIT and SCROOGE.

SPIRIT

That was the turning point, wasn't it? Nothing but

humbug.

SCROOGE

Please, Spirit, take me away from here.

SPIRIT

No. You shall see again each Christmas that followed The whole miserable growth of that terrible world of humbug.

And there follows a fast-moving almost nightmore sequence of Christmas upon Christmas of the world of SCROGE and business. The world in which everything that was not strictly business was nothing but humbug.

The sequence is fast moving. With many people coming and going. All in a rather brittle and stylised manner. A real nightmare.
