The Chair asked trustees in favor of the motion to say "Aye" and those opposed to say "No." The viva voce (by the voice) vote was taken and the Chair declared the "Ayes" have it and the motion carried.

#5-B. Report from Presidents: Informational reports were noted from each of the colleges.

#5-C. Report from Cabinet: George Woods, Dean of Workforce Education, presented an informational report on Coal Mining Technology. Penny Quinn, Dean of Instruction, reported that enrollment at LTC was up 30% during the recent Summer Term.

<u>AGENDA #8 – "Staff Recommendations for Approval"</u> – The following staff recommendations were presented for approval.

#8-A. Tentative FY08 Budget: The CEO reviewed the tentative budget for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2007, which was made available to the public on August 10 and remains available for public inspection through the scheduled September 18, 2007 Budget Hearing and Board meeting. Publication of the budget's availability and notice of the public hearing was made in district newspapers. The tentative fiscal year 2008 budget projects operating revenues of \$27,995,428 for the Education Fund and the Operations and Maintenance Fund. The document represents the current and best judgment of the district administration relative to anticipated revenues for fiscal year 2008, based on information available to date. The CEO recommended acceptance of the tentative budget as presented.

Board Action: Trustee Walter Koertge made a motion to accept the FY08 tentative budget as recommended. Trustee William Hudson seconded the motion and on a recorded roll call vote ordered by the Chair the following trustees voted yea: Brooks, Fischer, Hudson, Koertge, Rost, Wolfe. Trustees voting nay: None. Absent were Trustee Culver and Student Trustee Scott. The motion having received 6 yea votes and 0 nay votes, the Chair declared the motion carried.

#8-B. Lincolnland Agri Energy Appraisal Contract: The taxing bodies in Crawford County, the Supervisor of Assessment, and the Board of Review are engaged in a dispute over the proper assessment of property owned by Lincolnland Agri Energy, an ethanol processing plant located in

Crawford County. To settle the dispute over the proper assessment, the taxing bodies have agreed to hire a professional appraiser - Integra Realty Resources at a fee of \$30,000. The taxing bodies have agreed to pay the fee in the same proportion as the collection of taxes in Crawford County. Illinois Eastern Community Colleges collects 4.4% of the taxes and therefore would be responsible for \$1,335.31 of this fee amount.

<u>Recommendation:</u> The CEO recommended that IECC pay its fair share of the cost of an appraisal of Lincolnland Agri Energy property, if the Crawford County taxing bodies agree to do an appraisal.

Board Action: Trustee Marilyn Wolfe made a motion to approve the recommendation of the CEO relative to assessment of property owned by Lincolnland Agri Energy, that IECC pay its fair share of the cost of an appraisal if the Crawford County taxing bodies agree to do an appraisal. Trustee Larry Rost seconded the motion and on a recorded roll call vote ordered by the Chair the following trustees voted yea: Brooks, Fischer, Hudson, Koertge, Rost, Wolfe. Trustees voting nay: None. Absent were Trustee Culver and Student Trustee Scott. The motion having received 6 yea votes and 0 nay votes, the Chair declared the motion carried.

#8-C. Jasper County Tax Abatement for Evapco: Jasper County has an opportunity to attract a new plant to the City of Newton and has asked the assistance of Illinois Eastern Community Colleges. Evapco now operates a facility in Greenup, Illinois and has planned an expansion into Newton. Currently available is a building formerly occupied by E.R. Moore. To attract Evapco, all taxing bodies in Jasper County have agreed to abate 100% of the real estate taxes due for a period of five consecutive years from 2007 to 2012. Assurance has been given that there will be no request for an extension of this tax abatement after the five year period.

<u>Recommendation:</u> The CEO recommended adoption of the ordinance presented, titled "Ordinance Abating Real Estate Taxes on Real Estate Property Owned by Evapco, Inc. Located in the City of Newton, Illinois," and that the ordinance be made a part of the records of this community college district.

Board Action: Trustee Walter Koertge made a motion approve the tax abatement for the Evapco Building in Newton, Illinois as recommended. Trustee Larry Rost seconded the motion and on a recorded roll call vote ordered by the Chair the following trustees voted yea: Brooks, Fischer, Hudson, Koertge, Rost, Wolfe. Trustees voting nay: None. Absent were Trustee Culver and Student Trustee Scott. The motion having received 6 yea votes and 0 nay votes, the Chair declared the motion carried.

#8-D. Jasper County Eagle Country Water Works Waiver of Taxes Due: Eagle Country Water Works is a not-for-profit entity located in Newton, Illinois. They make substantial contributions each year to Jasper County Community Unit No. 1, Jasper County Boys and Girls Park, Jasper County Chamber of Commerce, local softball and baseball programs, and others. One year ago the Board of Trustees approved an abatement of taxes on the building occupied by Eagle Country for 2006. However, the tax exemption form filed by Eagle Country Water Works was not approved by the Illinois Department of Revenue in time to avoid 2006 taxes due and payable in 2007. Eagle Country Water Works has requested that the Board of Trustees waive collection of its taxes of \$259.58 due for the year 2006. The CEO recommended that the Board approve the waiver of taxes due for Eagle Country Water Works, Inc., for the year 2006.

Board Action: Trustee William Hudson made a motion to approve the waiver of taxes due for Eagle Country Water Works, Inc. for the year 2006 as recommended. Trustee Marilyn Wolfe seconded the motion and on a recorded roll call vote ordered by the Chair the following trustees voted yea: Brooks, Fischer, Hudson, Koertge, Rost, Wolfe. Trustees voting nay: None. Absent were Trustee Culver and

Student Trustee Scott. The motion having received 6 yea votes and 0 nay votes, the Chair declared the motion carried.

#8-E. Naming of Dennis Conley Field: Jack Davis, President of Olney Central College, has asked that the Baseball Field at Olney Central College be named for Dennis Conley. Mr. Conley has been Baseball Coach and Athletic Director at OCC for the past 28 years. During his tenure more than 180 students have had the opportunity to receive the benefits of higher education and the fine instruction he has given on the baseball field. Mr. Conley was recently recognized as Citizen of the Year by the Olney Chamber of Commerce. In presenting the award, it was noted that Mr. Conley has been very involved in the Olney community, especially in conducting summer recreational programs and being actively involved in Little League Baseball.

OCC President Jack Davis has stated that, "Mr. Conley's integrity is impeccable and he is an excellent role model for all students at Olney Central College." The CEO recommended approval to name the baseball field at Olney Central College, "Dennis Conley Field."

Affiliation Agreement – Pharmacy Technician – Fayette County Hospital – Vandalia: IECC wishes to enter into a new affiliation agreement with Heartland Health System Inc., located at Fayette County Hospital, Vandalia, Illinois. This affiliation agreement is for the Pharmacy Technician Program at Lincoln Trail College and is the standard affiliation agreement utilized by the District. The CEO recommended approval.

Board Action: Trustee Larry Rost made a motion to approve the affiliation agreement with Heartland Health System Inc., located at Fayette County Hospital for the Pharmacy Technician Program as recommended. On September 7, 2005, an employee of Illinois Eastern Community College District 529, John J. Reburn, was driving an IECC vehicle when a third party struck the IECC vehicle. Mr. Reburn was injured and immediately sought the employ of Mr. Woodcock. I will not be involved in any way with this client on this matter. I have also asked Mr. Woodcock that he not involve me in any discussion, research, drafting or preparation in any manner for this client and any claims he may file. Further, I ask that I not be involved in any future vote, discussion or any other Board action which relates to Mr. Reburn's matter.

Finally, I ask that this letter be either read or distributed to the Board when it meets at its next session, and that this letter be made a part of the minutes.

The plan and program will be organized and agreed to by said persons prior to the commencement of the courses.
- 3. DISTRICT #529 will be responsible for the teaching and guidance of the students in the clinical nursing laboratory practice, and will be available to the nursing students.

The specific assignment of learning experiences to specific students will be made and arranged by the Nursing Faculty on behalf of DISTRICT #529, in consultation with the Head Nurse, Supervisor or Coordinator on behalf of the AGENCY. Nursing Faculty assumes full

responsibility and supervision of the nursing students during their laboratory experience in the AGENCY.

- 4. The use of AGENCY facilities will be consistent with, and in conformity with all applicable rules, regulations, and policies of the AGENCY; and the Nursing Faculty on behalf of DISTRICT #529 will be responsible for maintaining proper standards of nursing care and safeguard of patients assigned to students. The AGENCY nursing personnel will retain full and final decisions for patient care assigned to nursing students.
- Supervision of the health of all students making use of any of the AGENCY'S
 facilities, as contemplated herein; will be the responsibility of DISTRICT #529, and will comply
 with the policies of the health AGENCY.

Nursing students and Nursing Faculty assigned to, or making use of any clinical area of the AGENCY under the contemplated program, will meet the health requirements of the AGENCY.

This agreement forbids discrimination against any student on the basis of age, color, race, national origin, gender, religion, or disability unrelated to the reasonable physical requirements of the job.

Prior to the use of any AGENCY facilities, under the contemplated program, DISTRICT #529 will furnish the AGENCY, upon request, a medical record for each participating student showing that said student fully complies with the health requirements required by the AGENCY.

- 6. The faculty of DISTRICT #529 participating in the program will receive an orientation to the AGENCY by the appropriate AGENCY staff. DISTRICT #529 Nursing Faculty participating in the program may be included in demonstrations of new equipment and techniques. Each new Nursing Faculty member of DISTRICT #529 participating in the program will arrange with the Director of Nursing Service, on behalf of the AGENCY, for an orientation prior to the assignment of the new Nursing Faculty member to any clinical area.
- DISTRICT #529 will provide orientation for the educational program for the AGENCY staff.
- 8. The AGENCY'S facilities may be available for DISTRICT #529 continuing educational program on a pre-planned project basis; the arrangements for such to be made with the Director of Nursing Service, on behalf of the AGENCY, and by the A.D. Department Head and/or Associate Dean, on behalf of DISTRICT #529.

- 9. The students and instructors will respect the confidential nature of all information which may come to them with regard to patients and AGENCY records.
- 10. Neither party hereto will be paid any monetary reimbursement as such by the other party heretofore for the contemplated program, or for use of either party's facilities by the other party. Neither party heretofore will have any responsibilities or liabilities to the other party, or its employees, or students, or anyone participating in the contemplated program. Nursing Faculty and nursing students shall be covered by malpractice insurance prior to any assignment for practice at the AGENCY.
- 11. The AGENCY will supply dressing rooms and space for storage of clothing not in use while students are practicing at the AGENCY, and conference room facilities for use of faculty and students.
- 12. An annual review of the agreement will be made each spring. Either party hereto may terminate this AGREEMENT by at least one (1) school calendar year's written notice to the other party. All students enrolled in DISTRICT #529's Associate Degree Nursing Program, and participating in the program contemplated herein at the time that notice to terminate this AGREEMENT is given by either party to the other, shall be permitted to complete their nursing laboratory experience needed for graduation at the AGENCY.

Illinois Eastern Community Colleges and the Bachelor of Arts in General Studies Degree Program at Eastern Illinois University form a cooperative relationship through this transfer agreement to better serve our public constituents, to smooth transfer, to minimize duplication of instruction, and to build on community college and university learning experiences. Both institutions recognize that working together, their collective efforts are stronger than their individual efforts.

The two institutions agree to the following:

- Any Illinois Eastern Community Colleges' (IECC) student who has:
 A) completed an Associate in Applied Science (A.A.S.) degree at Illinois
 - Eastern Community
 - Colleges, with the required 2.0 G.P.A., and
 - B) completed the hours specified for fulfillment of the Bachelor of Arts in General Studies degree general education requirements, and
 - C) submitted required application and supporting documentation, may be admitted to the Eastern Illinois University Bachelor of Arts in General Studies degree program at the junior level and will be deemed to have met the Bachelor of Arts in General Studies degree lower division general education requirements.
- 2. Acceptance into the Eastern Illinois University Bachelor of Arts in General Studies Degree Program is based on the individual transferring student meeting the conditions and considerations required for admission to the program.
- 3. All credits earned at Illinois Eastern Community Colleges or other regionally accredited institutions, with the exception of remedial courses, which meet graduation requirements of an IECC A.A.S. degree will be accepted as transfer to the Bachelor of Arts in General Studies Degree Program at Eastern Illinois University.
- 4. If Illinois Eastern Community Colleges graduation requirements for a particular A.A.S. degree do not meet or exceed the number of hours necessary to fulfill the general education requirements for the Eastern Illinois University Bachelor of Arts in General Studies degree, students may need to take additional courses to fulfill Bachelor of Arts in General Studies general education requirements (see list below). These additional hours, either lower division credits from Illinois Eastern Community Colleges or upper division credits from Eastern Illinois University, will apply toward

the 120 total semester hours required for the Eastern Illinois University Bachelor of Arts in General Studies degree.

General education requirements for the Eastern Illinois University Bachelor of Arts in General Studies degree include:

- 12 semester hours of math/natural sciences
- 12 semester hours of social and/or behavioral sciences
- 12 semester hours of humanities and/or fine arts
- 6 semester hours of communications/language
- 5. Relationships between Illinois Eastern Community Colleges and Eastern Illinois University faculty and administration are in the spirit of cooperation and provide the basis for this agreement.
- 6. Representatives of both institutions agree to meet on a regular basis to assess curricular changes and other conditions that may affect the nature of this agreement.
- 7. This agreement does not preclude either institution from making curriculum changes as it may solely deem appropriate in which case appropriate prior notice will be given to the operative academic personnel at the cooperating institution.
- 8. Appropriate publications and promotional materials regarding this agreement will be made available to all Illinois Eastern Community Colleges' students.
- 9. Either Eastern Illinois University or Illinois Eastern Community Colleges may dissolve this agreement by giving one year's advance notice to the cooperating institution's president or academic vice president.
- 10. This agreement is effective with the 2007 academic year and is subject to renewal in 2011.

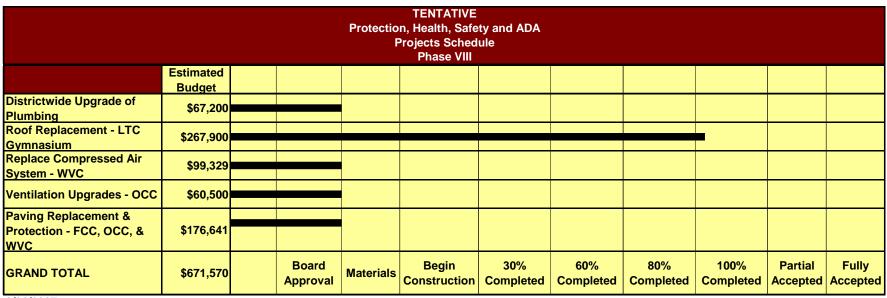
