**RANKING GUIDELINES**

The computer program shall be used to rank the level I and level II candidates for admission to NUR-1201 and NUR-2201.

The following guidelines shall be used to arrive at a ranking composite score: TEAS exam scores plus Cumulative GPA of nursing program support courses\* plus science composite score\*\* equals the ranking score. A computer program is used to provide accuracy.

To be ranked students must meet the following criteria of a TEAS and minimum GPA. Science Composite score can be used to increase the Ranking Score, but are a “bonus” and not a requirement.

**TEAS Test Scores:** Students must take and pass the TEAS exam with scores of 50% or higher in English, Reading, and Math; 40% or higher in Science to be considered for ranking. The exam may be taken twice each application process.

**Grade Point Average (GPA):** \*Cumulative GPA from nursing program support courses: average of course grades.

1. IECC pre nursing student use completed support courses.
2. High School Graduate/GED without support courses/transfer student without support courses use high school transcript: Math: Algebra I and II, Trigonometry, Calculus, Advanced Math, Geometry, Science: Biology I and II, Chemistry, Sociology/Psychology, English

**Science Composite Score \*\*:** (equated at **1.0** for each **A**; **.75** for each **B**; **.50** for **C** equals the ranking score)  
LSC-2111 Human Anatomy and Physiology I  
LSC-2112 Human Anatomy and Physiology II  
LSC-2110 General Microbiology

All data is to be reviewed and appropriate data entered into the computer program. If no appropriate data is available, i.e., GPA, leave the area blank or enter a zero. ***Only the computer ranking is considered for finalizing scores.***

**The minimum entry level composite score is 6.0**, which is derived from the placement test, ranking GPA, and science courses. All students are ranked according to this score with in-district residents given preference.

**Please note:** Returning students must have a cumulative 2.5 GPA to be eligible for ranking, exclusive of nursing course to be repeated.
