#### **NURSING SCHOLARSHIPS**

All nursing awards go to level 1 students to be paid Fall of level 2

BRAZITIS SCHOLARSHIP: (1) \$1,250.00 awarded annually to a level 1 nursing student to be used for tuition, fees,
other school related expenses and living expenses. Must be under 35 years of age, and a Richland County
resident. Submit personal goal statement and record of academic achievement.

☐ MARY E HARTRICH NURSING SCHOLARSHIP: Awarded in odd years to a level 1 incoming nursing student with amount based on annual interest earned from the fund. Award is to cover tuition, fees, books, insurance, uniforms and board testing throughout the second year nursing program.

	SUMATHI NATARAJAN MEMORIAL NURSING SCHOLARSHIP: Variable award made to a level 1 nursing student attending OCC. Funds are intended to help with costs to include tuition, fees, insurance, uniforms, and board testing.
	KATRINA AND MINNIE WEBER SCHOLARSHIP: \$1000 award annually to an OCC level 1 nursing student. The award is to be used for tuition, fees, uniforms, books, insurance and other expenses. Student should show record of merit.
	NELLIE YELCH SCHOLARSHIP: \$1000 award to OCC level 1 nursing student to be used for tuition, fees, books, equipment. Student should be full time and in good standing academically.
PERFO	RMING AND VISUAL ARTS SCHOLARSHIPS
	MARY LOU BROWN SCHOLARSHIP: Student must be a current OCC Art student, maintain 2.5 GPA, and participate in art showcase. The annual award is based on interest earned by the fund and is to be used for tuition, fees, art supplies and books.
	* RUTH HENRY SCHOLARSHIP: \$500 award given to a first or second year student in the performing arts. Award is based on merit/performance. Student must show record of activities (drama, music, choir, or band), maintain a 2.5 GPA and participate in performing arts programs while attending OCC.
	JAMES F KELLEY MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIPS: (2) \$1000 awards annually to one vocal music student and one instrumental music student. Students should be entering their sophomore year at OCC and the money is to be used for tuition, fees, music related expenses. Students should be pursuing music career and actively engage in community service.
<u>EDUC</u>	ATION SCHOLARSHIIPS
	JACKIE DAVIS EDUCATION SCHOLARSHIP: (1) education scholarship for \$2000 given to a 2 <sup>nd</sup> year education major transferring to a 4-year school to pursue a degree in Education. Preferably this should be a non-traditional/older full time student, maintain 3.0 GPA and perform 8 hours/semester community service.
	FRANCES STENCEL TEACHING SCHOLARSHIPS: (2) \$500 awards to graduating sophomores transferring to a 4-year school to major in teaching/education. Student should be an A-B student, be of good character, be of service to OCC or community and desire to be a teacher.
SCIENC	CE SCHOLARSHIPS
	* HOFFMAN SCHOLARSHIP: Botanical Science Book stipend of \$150 and the rest of the award will be based on interest earned by the fund (up to \$500/semester). Student is required to take Comp II class at OCC. Student is to prepare an original research paper on native Illinois wildflowers, grasses or trees. This award can be granted to the same student more than once.
	JOHN STENCEL BIOLOGY SCHOLARSHIPS: (2) \$500 awards to graduating sophomores in Biology. Students should have an A-B average, be involved in school or community service and be of good character.

#### **HEALTHCARE SCHOLARSHIPS**

Ш	annually to one student from Richland County and one student from Clay County. Current OCC students must be enrolled full or part time in nursing or radiography and committed to practice in Illinois. Award is to go toward tuition and fees.
	* KENTON PEAK SCHOLARSHIP: \$1000 annually to an OCC or FCC student in para-medical, EM responder, or other healthcare program. Award is to be used for tuition, books, fees and program related expenses. Student should maintain a 2.5 GPA, can be either incoming freshman or sophomore, take an active role in emergency preparedness, and plan to serve as an EMT or healthcare provider after graduation.
	* DOUG SHEHORN SCHOLARSHIP: Amount of award based on annual interest accrued and given to student in health sciences, pre-med or health related field.
<u>ENGIN</u>	IEERING SCHOLARSHIP
	JACKIE DAVIS ENGINEERING SCHOLARSHIP: \$2000 scholarship given to a current full time, first year engineering OCC student who will transfer to a 4-year school to pursue a degree in engineering. Student should maintain a 3.25 GPA.
RADIC	OGRAPHY SCHOLARSHIP
	JACKIE DAVIS RADIOGRAPHY SCHOLARSHIP: Scholarship given to a current full-time, first-year radiography OCC student who should maintain a 3.0 GPA.
GENER	AL SCHOLARSHIPS
	LEOLA BASS SCHOLARSHIP: Variable award for a current OCC student based on fund interest income annually.
	A.C. BETEBENNER SCHOLARSHIPS: (3) \$500 scholarships to 2 <sup>nd</sup> year students who will be graduating with ASA, o AS degree. Applicants should be successful and committed to a worthy career goal.
	CLIO CLUB SCHOLARSHIP: \$200 annual character award given to a graduating female demonstrating outstanding character and is conscientious in pursuing her chosen course of study. Prefer student with average or higher grades, good work habits and desire to continue her education.
	COCHRAN AND KISSEL SCHOLARSHIP: Amount of award is based on annual interest earned from the fund. Criteria to be considered is based on promise of success in field of study for a current OCC student.
	OCC FOUNDATION AWARDS: (2) \$500 awards – one to a student graduating with AAS degree and one to a student graduating with ASA degree.
	SHICK & THOMPSON SCHOLARSHIP: Amount of award based on annual interest from the fund. The current OCC student should have good academics and extenuating circumstances.
	* BAILEY AND BRYSON WALKER TRIO SCHOLARSHIP: \$500 award annually given to a student who shall have held a part-time job in the previous year and during time of receiving award, maintain a 3.0 GPA, be a 1 <sup>st</sup> generation college student. OCC student is preferred but if none, then IECC-wide trio student can be awarded.

WOMEN'S CLUB SCHOLARSHIP: $$100/year$ to a female student entering $2^{nd}$ year with a "B" average in the humanities field.
YARBROUGH SCHOLARSHIP: Award based on annual interest earned from the fund. Awarded to a current OCC student who demonstrates promise of success in their chosen field.
